**WOULD YOU LIKE TO READ THE BIBLE?**

The Bible is the recorded story of how God created and then saved the human race. Most Catholics are familiar with various parts of these Holy Scriptures, but how many of us have actually read the Bible from cover to cover? With a few explanations and a little perseverance, ANYONE can read the Bible. Starting this Fall, the Bible Study will be devoted to reading the Holy Scriptures from beginning to end. We will be concentrating on reading as far as we can in about an hour and fifteen minutes per Wednesday evening session, with the aim of completing the entire Bible in about a year. For an incredible, life-changing experience, bring your Bible and **join us this Fall**, beginning on **September 15, at 7:30 PM, in Walsh Hall**. Any Catholic edition of the Bible will do. Study guides, bibliographies, maps, and other materials will be provided on a week to week basis to increase our knowledge of what we are reading.

**THE NEW TRANSLATION OF THE MASS**

For the last several years, Church-appointed scholars have been making a new translation of the words of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. All of the prayers of the Mass - the prayers which we say at every Mass as well as the prayers that change with every Mass - have been newly rendered into English, as called for by our late Holy Father, John Paul II. In order to understand why a new translation is needed, and to prepare ourselves for praying the Mass in it, Fr. Mark Carrier will give two talks this Fall, on **Thursday, October 7 and 14**, in the church. The first talk will focus on the definition of the Holy Mass and on its history and development through the centuries. The second talk will include practicing with the new translation of the Mass prayers. The Holy Mass is the central activity of the Church as it is the perfect worship of almighty God in offering him the Body and Blood of His Son. By preparing ourselves properly, we will offer Him this worship in an even more befitting way, and receive the benefits that come from a clear understanding of what we are doing at Mass, and why we are doing it.



**Footsteps of John Paul II Pilgrimage to Poland & Rome**  
Please join Father Pokorsky, Pastor of St. Michael’s and Father Denis Kleinmann, Pastor of St. Mary’s in Alexandria, on a nine-day pilgrimage beginning in Poland and ending in Rome to trace the footsteps of John Paul II from Wadowice, his birthplace, to Krakow, where he was Archbishop, to Rome where he served as pope for almost 27 years. The pilgrimage concludes with the canonization of Brother Andre Bessette, the founder of St. Joseph’s Oratory in Montreal, Canada and the first native born male Canadian to be so honored. In Poland, we will also visit the Shrine of the Divine Mercy where St. Faustina lived and had her apparitions of Christ. ### **Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Montessori Atrium for children 3-9 years old**



Saint Louis offers a Catholic Montessori Atrium program called "Catechesis of the Good Shepherd" for children between the ages of 3 and 9. Level 1 is for 3-6 year olds, and Level 2 is for 6-9 year olds. Children generally attend one atrium session per week. Each session is two hours. We offer several Level 1 atrium sessions in the morning and one Level 2 atrium session after the Saint Louis school dismissal.

The program is held in an "Atrium," which is a room prepared especially for young children to learn about the life of Jesus and the Liturgy of the Church (specifically, the Holy Mass and Baptism).

We still have 15 openings left for Level 1 and 5 openings left for Level 2 for the Fall 2010 – Spring 2011. If you register by September 1, 2010, the registration fee is \$25. After September 1, 2010, the registration fee is \$50. *Your non-refundable registration fees secure your child's placement in the atrium.*
