There are still OPENINGS for Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Montessori Atrium program for 3 to 9+ year olds.

Children gather in a room specially prepared for them, called an atrium, which contains simple yet beautiful materials that they use to draw near to God. In the early church, the atrium was the place where the catechumens were prepared. For the child, the atrium is a place of preparation for deeper involvement and enjoyment of the Mass and the Sacraments. Children usually attend atrium one day per week; although, they can attend more frequently if desired.

- Level I openings (for 3-6 year olds) on Mon, Fri, and Sat from 10am - 12noon.
- Level II openings (for 6-9+ year olds) are on Mon 2:30-4:30pm, and Tues 1:30-3:30pm.

Even though the CGS atrium program has already begun, we are still accepting new children. Registration forms are available in the back of the church, on the Saint Louis website (www.saintlouisparish.org/atrium.html) or can be emailed to you.
